A FEW THOUGHTS FROM THE PASTOR

Advent is by far my favorite season of the church year. Not only are we seeing the beginnings of changes in creation around us- mornings are crisper, and snow is starting to fall, but we are seeing the beginnings of the changes in our own church- the sanctuary is now adorned in blue and our advent wreath takes a prominent position in our worship space.

Too often, Advent becomes a time of “waiting until Christmas”, but it is so much more than that. Advent is not just the few weeks before Christmas, it is the beginning of the church year- a time when we do much more than just wait and remember the birth of Jesus, we recognize that the future and the past are blurred into the season- *God breaks into our reality right now*. Advent bridges time and space, asking us to plead for our Immanuel, God-with-us, yet also recognize that our Immanuel **is** with us, joining us for worship, meeting us at the altar rail, infused into our lives as people of God.

Most of us will keep an advent calendar in our homes, opening the little windows for each day of the advent season. This advent, I encourage us to recognize the in-breaking of God into each new day, instead of merely “counting down until Christmas” taking time to look around us and see Immanuel, God-with-us, in breath, in snowfall, in bread broken. Let us not just wait out these days with anticipation of Christmas, let us really live into these days, recognizing the blurring of the past story of God's people with the future, leading us to live an incredible present.

HISTORICALLY SPEAKING

World War II hit Irving Park Lutheran Church hard. Eleven of our service personnel died in battle. By the end of WWII, 388 IPLC sons and daughters had served their country.

A box containing letters from almost 250 IPLC members was recently discovered in a church storage area. Thankfully, during WWII, Pastor Joshua Oden and church secretary Mildred Bogren had the foresight to save the letters. Now, more than 60 years later, we'd like to return as many letters as possible to the relatives of our World War II heroes.

The letters provide a fascinating insight into the entire war effort and life in the 1940s.

"The Tidings" literally had a worldwide circulation during WWII. Our letter writers often mentioned they were grateful to receive "The Tidings," prayer books, letters and cookies from the folks back home. Letters came back from around the globe, including Pearl Harbor, Africa, Italy, France, England, Australia, New Guinea and the Philippines. One was even written on a submarine. Also, there are countless stories of life at military bases across the country. They all had one thing in common ... they truly appreciated IPLC and looked forward to returning home.

A few highlights from the hundreds of discovered letters:

There are letters from a few of our current members, and copies of letters written by Pastor Oden. One soldier wrote a compelling letter written to his 1-year-old son. There are scores of "V-Mails" and newspaper clippings, including a story on the fighting Davis family of Milburn, Eldridge, LeRoy and Melvin. There are letters from politicians, including First Lady Eleanor Roosevelt (who was invited to attend one of many Service Flag dedications at IPLC).

Many are from homesick, lovesick and just plain sick soldiers. One was writing to Pastor Oden from his Red Cross hospital bed as actor Basil Rathbone was entertaining the troops. Another wrote about taking communion at a church in Europe with Gen. George Patton kneeling next to him. There also are many inspirational letters to Pastor Oden from Edmund Lust, who was killed in action.

Elsewhere in this edition of "The Tidings" is a list of the letter writers. You may find names of a grandparent, uncle, aunt, cousin or neighbor. We'd like to return the letters, but to relatives only. ETHIOPIA ORPHAN PROJECT

The AIDS pandemic is a tragedy that is sweeping through the African continent. Approximately 2,500,000 people are dying every year and it is estimated that there are more than 13,000,000 AIDS orphans, with almost no infrastructure to support them. In Ethiopia there are at least a million orphans already and many more are expected as the growth of AIDS continues throughout the country. About one in six AIDS orphans is HIV-positive.

Chances by Choice is a non-profit foundation started in 2002 by Margaret Fleming, a recognized expert in the field of international adoptions. In the summer of 2006, spurred by their recent work with HIV-positive orphans in Ethiopia, Chances by Choice started a project to build an orphanage complex in Ethiopia to provide for the care and support of HIV-positive orphans. The vision is to build an orphanage complex which can provide adoption, education, job training, and medical services within a single facility.

In July of 2006, former IPLC Ministry Project Coordinator Norman Clearfield traveled to Ethiopia and witnessed

firsthand the incredible poverty of Ethiopia and the devastation caused by AIDS. Since then, Chances by Choice has made tremendous strides toward realizing our dream of opening an orphanage.

We have almost completed the process of securing the necessary legal agreements to begin orphanage operations in Ethiopia, and we have identified three staff people who are interested in helping us get our orphanage project started in Ethiopia. As soon as we have secured our first \$20,000 in funds, we will be able to begin hiring staff.

Please join us at IPLC on December 3rd when after worship lunch will be served and we will be showing a ten-minute video about our project work in Ethiopia. Norm will be available after lunch to answer questions the project.

Also, please mark your calendars for the afternoon of Sunday, January 14, 2007, when Rob Clearfield and friends will be performing a benefit concert for the Ethiopia project at LaSalle Street Church in Chicago. More information will be available in the January Tidings.
